We hereby commit to engaging in the protection of biodiversity and undertaking the following practical actions:

- 1. The company's operations aim to have a net positive impact (NPI) on the environment and ecology and are committed to preserving biodiversity. If the company's operations impact biodiversity, we will adopt measures in order of priority to avoid, minimize, restore, and offset the effects, reducing ecological impacts.
- 2. Comply with international and local forest-related laws or specific regulations, and adopt the Zero Net Deforestation principle to avoid excessive forest logging.
- 3. Continuously promote biodiversity conservation and the issue of non-deforestation to employees, suppliers, and the public, and support and practice biodiversity conservation and forest preservation.
- 4. Regarding supplier management, the company will include compliance with biodiversity conservation principles and non-deforestation commitments as one of the items for supplier evaluation and audits.
